PRESENTATION FOR NH CATHOLICS ON END-OF-LIFE DECISIONS

On **July 26** at 6 p.m., Marc Guillemette, Director of Catholic Identity at Catholic Medical Center, will discuss the Diocese of Manchester's Three Beliefs – A Guide for NH Catholics on End-of-Life Decisions. During the presentation, there will be a review of the Church's teaching regarding care and medical treatment at the end of life. Copies of the Three Beliefs, which includes a NH Advanced Directives (Living Will) form, will be distributed and reviewed. The presentation will be here at St. Catherine.

THURSDAYS ON PENNACOOK STREET

A young woman told the sidewalk counselors she did not understand English and said, "Swahili." One of the women praying each Thursday outside PP speaks five languages, including Swahili, so she spoke to the young woman. She said she had an appointment and had been referred by another medical facility. When she left she was holding sheets of paper and said there was "no doctor" in and didn't want to say any more. Several women were seen leaving with arm bandages that cover the incisions for Nexplanon, an implanted birth control. It, like other forms of contraception, can cause abortions early in pregnancy.

HOW TO REPORT SUSPECTED ABUSE

If you know of or suspect abuse or neglect of a minor (a person under 18), you must report it to the NH Division for Children, Youth and Families at 1-800-894-5533 or 603-271-6556. As an employee or volunteer in the Catholic Church in New Hampshire, in addition to reporting to DCYF, if you know of or suspect sexual abuse of a minor by Church personnel you must also report it to local law enforcement and the Delegate for Ministerial Conduct (603-669-3100). If the abuse involves a person who is no longer a minor, contact the Delegate for Ministerial Conduct.
